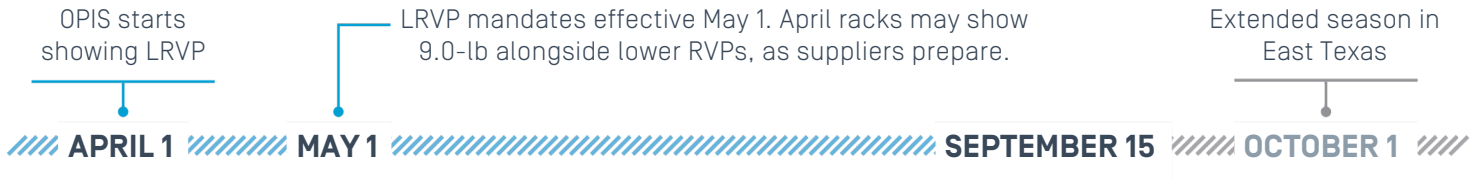

To help manage ozone levels, most U.S. cities switch to 9.0-lb RVP gasoline during the summer months—unless stricter federal Reformulated Gasoline [RFG] mandates, state opt-in rules, or voluntary refiner initiatives require lower volatility.

For the 2026 season, the EPA is waiving Low-RVP [LRVP] requirements for both Conventional and Reformulated Gasoline. The agency intends to issue successive waivers every 20 days until fuel supply disruptions have stabilized. Consequently, OPIS plans to display a 9.0-lb RVP standard for all conventional gasoline racks until the waivers expire or lower requirements are reinstated.

Low RVP displayed in OPIS rack reports

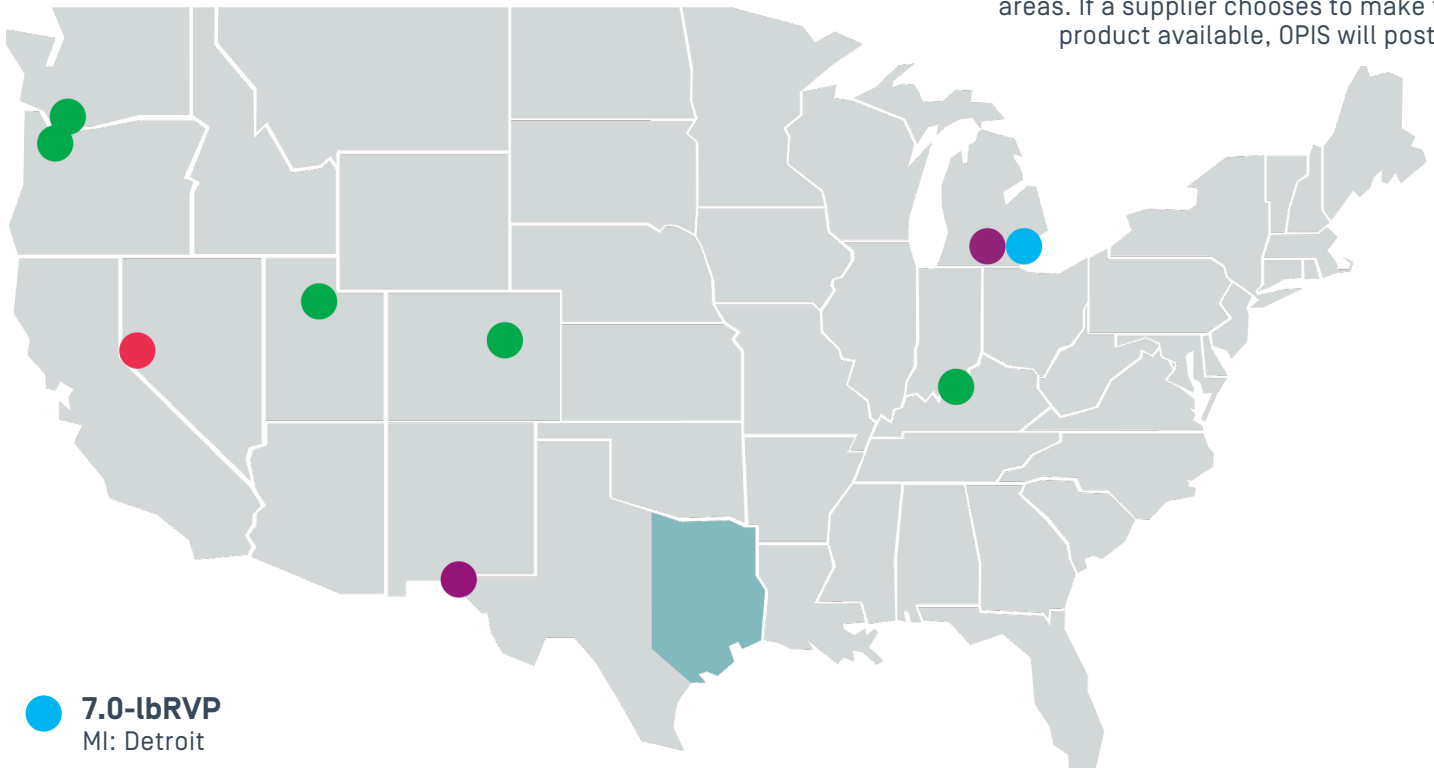


Reformulated Gasoline [RFG]

If a city is part of the federal RFG program, our reports won't specify the RVP. Phoenix, AZ & California are primarily RFG markets, coded CBG [Clean Burning Gasoline] or CaRFG [California RFG] due to geographical requirements.

Additional RVP levels may appear in markets where they are not required if such fuel is available for sale outside mandated areas. If a supplier chooses to make this product available, OPIS will post it.
